General Information To be devoted to the Parable of The Sower.

Whitehouse writes: "I might suggest that any figure or figures be kept small in scale. Also there is quite a "sameness" of color in all these chapel windows. Could we not get a little more dramatic and be a little more colorful, quite warm? My reason for suggesting figures small in scale is because in viewing the same one cannot get more than 10 to 12 feet away."

We have completed our study of the design for the window devoted to Our Lord's parable of the Sower, and are sending you the color sketch, herewith.

It is planned to harmonize with the earlier windows, but with accent on small jewel-like pieces and a somewhat warmer palette.

The dominant medallion represents the Sower planting his seed in the field. Below he gathers his harvest. Above is the book of the Word of God.

We feel that this will beautifully complement the other windows, introducing a different but harmonious note.
