around the design, suggesting the  
symbol on the Sisters' scapular*

As planned, the larger one over the altar is devoted to the Incarnate Word. The Child Jesus stands with arms extended on a background suggesting the cross, between symbols of the Passion, - the Crown of Thorns and the three nails; and the chalice symbol of the Blessed Sacrament. The three stars imply the Trinity.

Other Eucharistic symbols, the wheat and the grapes, enrich the border.

At the base is the text, "Praise be the Incarnate Word". Of course this and all other details of lines and form will be very carefully developed in the full size drawings and the actual glass.
