General Information This window is devoted to the Boy Christ in the Temple
conversing with the Doctors.

Our Lord is seated in a receptive attitude, with the text, - "Sitting in the
Midst of the Doctors, both hearing them and asking them questions." In the
upper medallion the Christ Child plays with a lamb, with the young Saint
John the Baptist as His companion, according to an ancient legend.

See sketches for other being made at same time, and of windows in place.

*IMPORTANT: Mr. Born writes. "The Nativity window on the south is very beautiful.
However, we would like to point out that this window tends to let a considerable
amount of light come through, which is all right because of its location, but we do
not believe this would be desirable for the other windows on the south side. We
have a considerable period of sunlight and it is our considered opinion that
if the other windows on the south side would permit as much light to pass
through, this would become a rather intolerable situation...."(BE SURE TO DEEPEN
THE PALETTE AND TEXTURE OF THESE SOUTH WINDOWS TO TAKE CARE OF THE STRONG LIGHT.)
