Saint Elizabeth. (The donor likes the type of figure in Rock Creek.)
(This window will be in memory of the donor's Mother. The Window
devoted to Saint Stephen will be in memory of her Father, and they
should harmonize.) although they may be different in color schemes.

This will be in the red scheme, but have as much blue as possible, as the
donor writes: "Red is a violent color to me, and I have never liked it.
Could that red be changed to a purple ...Mother liked lavender and
purple too, and yellow...I do not object to some red, in fact I think it
desirable, but I do not like it to predominate as it does in one of the
designs which you sent "

(We said we would modify the red, introducing purple or some similar
color that will not disturb the over-all harmony.)

Saint Elizabeth...We have greatly modified the reds of the borders, introducing cooler notes of purple and lavender, and keeping the fields in tones of blue, accented with gold.

However, the figure of Saint Elizabeth is clothed in lovely rubies, the traditional color of Divine Love. She is crowned and holds a rose ~~of Divine~~ as well as the basket of bread, recalling her lovely legend.

Although the detail is only roughly suggested at this small scale, we plan the careful development of line and form in the full size drawings and the actual glass, as you have seen it in photographs of our windows, especially the one in the Rock Creek Church at Washington, D.C.

This window will make a lovely companion to the one devoted to Saint Stephen, and we are eager to develop both of them as lovely memorials to enrich Saint John's Church...
