General Information On contract. "We prefer the figure of Our Lord to the alternate Maltese Cross for the center Quarterfoil"

We are sending you the sketch, herewith. As planned, it is devoted to the way of true Christian life, as set forth by Our Lord in the Beatitudes, with symbols of each designed in a pattern of growing vines suggesting the Tree of Life.

The Dove represents the Blessed poor in Spirit, the Inverted Torch for those that mourn, the Lamb for the meek, the Scales for those who hunger and thirst after righteousness, the Broken Sword of the meek, the Lily for the pure in heart, the Olive Branch for the peacemakers, and the Heavenly Crown for those who are persecuted for righteousness sake.

In the central quatrefoil is the Maltese Cross of Regeneration, certainly an appropriate and excellent symbol. We have also suggested the figure of Our Lord as an alternative. The quatrefoil is large enough to represent
