General Information Design to be changed from our earlier plan - we are to use a two-medallion scheme. (Jewel-like brilliant treatment).

#4745 Window #4 to be a sportsmen's window. This is in memory of a fisherman. (similar to Albuquerque). "I think of the contributions sportsmen make to the culture of a nation and of how even our Lord depended on the fisherman's catch for sustenance. Perhaps the St. Lawrence might be featured in a medallion or other part."

Suggest significant parallels between Biblical and modern themes including the Miraculous Draught of Fishes. In quatrefoil, the Fish with Greek Rebus; Upper medallion, Miraculous Draught of Fishes; lower, 2 men fishing from boat; smaller medallions - A sailboat on lake; and an ocean lines on the St. Lawrence River.

"The window No. 5 should commemorate the contributions of the men of science and medicine to the healing of mankind and the relief of suffering. To be in memory of a husband and wife, the latter being a great aid to her ailing neighbors through the use of massage, etc... men and women, doctors, nuns and nurse could be featured..."

Caduceus in quatrefoil; upper medallion, Christ healing nobleman's Son, (John 4: 50); lower medallion, Doctor with nurse at bedside of Patient. Small medallions, Nursing nun; scientist in lab.

#7. "to be in memory of the donor of all these and his wife, and might be tied in with the theme by indicating the contributions made in wartime by those who render unto Caesar what he needs at home..."

Upper medallion, "Munitions worker, lower, Hospital - Devoted to War Service, at Home... a mother and two children at home, praying. Include Service Star symbol; lower

This is designed as the Sportsmen's window. It symbolises the contributions of sportsmen to the culture of the nation, and suggests how even Our Lord depended on the fisherman's catch for sustenance.

The upper medallion is devoted to the Miraculous Draught of Fishes as related in the twenty-first Chapter of Saint John's Gospel.

Below are contemporary fishermen, - "These see the works of the Lord, and his wonders in the deep" (Psalm 107-24).

Small inserts symbolize a sail boat and a vessel on the St. Lawrence, - "The voice of the Lord is upon the waters".

In the quatrefoil above is the Fish symbol of Our Lord with the Greek rebus of His name.

The field and borders are designed in a growing and flowering vine pattern.

North Aisle Window, fifth from the Chancel,

This window is designed to commemorate the contribution of men of Science and Medicine to the healing of mankind and the relief of suffering.

The upper medallion is devoted to the Healing of the Nobleman's Son (John 4:50). The son at home in bed is suggested at the top.

The lower medallion represents the modern physician in the home or hospital, attending a patient.

Small inserts suggest a nursing nun and a research scientist in his laboratory.

The ancient caduceus symbol of Medicine is designed in the quatrefoil.

North Aisle Window, seventh from the Chancel,
Saint John's Church, Ogdensburg.

This window is devoted to War Service at home.

In the upper medallion a family is gathered in prayer, with the Service Star above.

Munition workers in the factory are grouped below, and in the intermediate medallions are roughly indicated the Red Cross Nurse, and the Civilian Defense volunteer with helmet, arm band and light.

In the quatrefoil above is the Army and Navy E award for excellent contributions to the War effort.
