General Information ~~Mr. Harrington of Copley Manufacturing Company gave price for 8 pieces of 1/4 inch plate glass - 14" x 14" - each to have a design sandblasted to a little depth (similar to the last job they did for us for Newton College of the Sacred Heart) - approximately 12 inches square - the price to be \$198. If we make the patterns for them, the price would be \$175.~~

Mr. Horan wrote: Feb. 11, 1963 "The three leaded glass windows in the chapel are to be glazed with cathedral glass. The Sister would like clear glass." Feb. 15, 1963; we quoted to Mr. Horan "glaze the 3 chapel windows in clear glass at the same cost we have quoted for Cathedral Glass, that is \$600. *see 4705* the additional cost of the leaded glass panel in the door between the chapel and the sacristy in clear glass, is \$85."

Copley Manufacturing Co quoted "1 Panel of 1/4" plate glass, 59-3/8" x 18-3/8"; cut to pattern, lettering and design sandblasted into face per your cartoon. Full scale working drawing made from your cartoon. As quoted, \$69.65"
