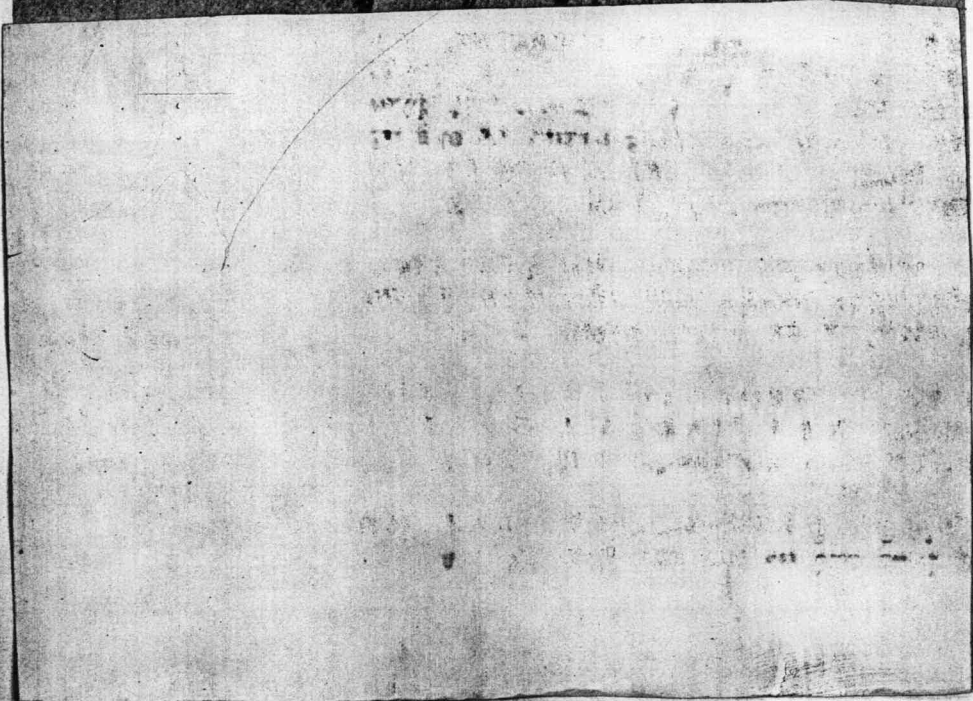

As planned, the one on the east side is devoted to Our Lord's significant parable of the Prodigal Son.

The father welcomes the repentant youth on his return home from tending swine, while the disconsolate brother watches preparations for the feast of rejoicing.

The opposite window is designed to continue the series of allegorical themes with figures symbolizing Faith and Hope, Worship and Prayer.

Faith contemplates the Cross, while the Anchor of Hope is represented below. Worship visualizes Our Lord in glory, while Prayer kneels with the open book inscribed with the cross. Thus we have an introduction to the spirit of worship, with the significant lesson of repentance and forgiveness in the opposite window.
