General Information The text proposed: Psalm 122, the first verse, representing David and Solomon as the main figures, and include little representations of a building, the architect and builder, presenting plans and materials to Solomon.

Psalm 122. Verse I: ~~"I was glad when they said unto me"~~ Let us go into the house of the Lord.

Proverb "Wisdom hath builded her house" (Proverb 9:1)

As planned, it is devoted to the Old Testament Kings and Builders,- David and Solomon.

David stands with his six pointed starry sceptre, with small inserts in the field suggesting the young David playing before Saul.

The suggested text is from Psalm 122, first verse,- "Let us go into the house of the Lord".

Solomon holds the model of the temple, with workmen below,- perhaps the architect and builder presenting plans and materials to Solomon.

Here the suggested text is from Proverbs 9:1,- "Wisdom hath builded her house".

Kneeling angels accompany the texts, and Angels of prayer and praise are designed above.

The decorative canopy is planned to harmonise with the neighboring windows.
