To be no memorial inscriptions in any  
of these windows

Troto and I met the Committee and Architect (Wilson).

Showed them the inch scale sketches and others.

They had no ideas on subject beyond the wish for "Inspirational"  
themes,- not material,- not trades and occupations.

They liked the idea of the Sermon on the Mount, with the  
loaves and fishes, and Beatitudes for the big front window and  
implications of the Old Testament on one side and the New on the  
other.

They felt color was the important thing, theme and subject  
secondary. (Architect said he had seen very fine windows with no  
subject, just abstract).

We mentioned Old Testament characters such as Jacob, Joseph,  
Moses, Joshua, Gideon, Samuel, David (Jonathan), Daniel, Isaiah.  
Figures or symbols?

For the New Testament we mentioned, - the Fruit of the  
Spirit, in a Jesse Tree arrangement springing from the Holy Spirit,  
while the Old Testament springs from some Old Testament symbol,  
such as the Burning Bush. Or the Corporal Acts of Mercy, or  
Parables for the New.

It was left that we should make sketches in consultation  
with the architect; with whom we should plan all the construction  
details.

One man mentioned recognition of all religions, but it  
hardly seems that can be worked in to any extent.

We mentioned costs. Said we were trying to keep as near  
as possible to \$2500. That was Ruocco's rough estimate for just  
a medallion in the side windows. (He was the only other consulted).

We said, roughly \$12,700. for the big window; \$11,800. for  
the two side ones, and around \$5,000. for simple nave windows.  
Roughly, \$29,000. to \$30,000. with the upper aisles to be memorials,  
extra.

They already have twelve of these and are mentioning \$1200. each. Think they will have all before the windows are done. There are twenty-two of these. Subjects not yet planned. We should be thinking about this and take them into consideration in the plan.

They mentioned contracts or agreements, and we will go into this when the sketches are accepted.

The long windows extend clear down on both sides of the nave, but one side opens on a corridor. Architect wants light obscured glass on the corridor side and deeper on open side, to balance. Should study this with him.

One suggested a small part of the aisle memorial costs could be put back in the general cost of the aisle windows.
