General Information Make two rough sketches - one for Christ the King, very much like the Rye, New Hampshire, and the other Christ in the Sermon on the Mount with symbols of the Beatitudes.

Father Mulcahy wants very good windows. He thinks they should be the important feature.

As suggested, we have prepared alternate rough sketches for the rose or circular window, - one symbolizing ~~Our Lord's Sermon on the Mount, and the other, Christ the King.~~

In the first, He is seated on the Mount bearing the eight pointed Cross symbolizing the Beatitudes. In the field is the sacred monogram, and at His feet, the Globe, with the Commandments at one side and the Scriptures at the other, symbolizing the Old and the New Dispensations. The listeners are grouped at either side, with Cherubim in the small triangular shapes.

Christ the King enthroned, bears the sceptre and globe surmounted by the Cross symbolizing His triumph over the world. Attendant Angels are designed at either side of the throne, and seven white Doves symbolize the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Either design would work out beautifully in the actual glass. Personally, I am inclined to favor Christ the King for its great majesty.

The Pastor prefers the design with Christ the King, but in deeper, richer color, with a ruby cloak for Christ, which means a blue background, and red backgrounds for the angels with blue wings.

Keep Father Mulcahy posted on progress. He may come to see cartoons.
