General Information This window is designed as the Sportsmen's window. It symbolizes the contributions of sportsmen to the culture of the nation, and suggests how even Our Lord depended on the fisherman's catch for sustenance.

The upper medallion is devoted to the Miraculous Draught of Fishes as related in the twenty-first Chapter of Saint John's Gospel.

Below are contemporary fishermen, - "These see the works of the Lord, and his wonders in the deep" (Psalm 107-24).

Small inserts symbolize a sailboat and a vessel on the St. Lawrence, - "The voice of the Lord is upon the waters".

In the quatrefoil above is the Fish symbol of Our Lord with the Greek rebus of His name.

The field and borders are designed in a growing and flowering vine pattern.
