General Information **Life of Christ - See plan of subjects they sent**

The east window is devoted to the Life of Christ, with His Birth, the Epiphany, and in the Temple with the Doctors, across the base.

There follows His Baptism by John the Baptist; His Transfiguration; and Temptation; Palm Sunday, Gethsemane; and Before Pilate; the Crucifixion, with His Mother and Saint John, the beloved disciple beside the cross; the radiant figure of the Risen Christ at the centre (sleeping soldiers below); and the Ascension. Traditional symbols of the Sacrifice and Resurrection enrich the spandrels, - the Pelican feeding its young with its life's blood, and the Phoenix rising anew from the flames of its nest.
