General Information This is to be one of the parable windows representing the Rich Man and Lazarus, Luke 16:19-31; the Unjust Steward, Luke 16:1-9, and the Pharisee and the Publican, Luke 8:9-14.

See photograph of the window in the south wall of the west transept which is the same size and type, but have a little different pattern of medallions in this panel.

We have completed our study of the design for your east transept window and are sending you the color sketch, herewith. It is planned to harmonize with the balancing one in the opposite transept.

The upper medallion represents the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, Luke 16:19-31; the Unjust Steward is symbolized at the center, Luke 16:1-9; with the Pharisee and the Publican at the base, Luke 8:9-14.
