General Information Subject: St. James the Less and St. Jude

We have enjoyed our study of another window for your Church, for which we are sending you the color sketch, herewith.

It is devoted to two more of Our Lord's Apostles, Saint James the Less and Saint Jude. Although the names of both are included, they are further identified by their traditional symbols.

Saint James bears the fuller's bat, instrument of his martyrdom, and below, the staff and stones, the latter again in reference to his martyrdom.

Saint Jude holds the sail-boat with the cross-shaped mast in reference to his missionary journeys with Saint Simon. Below are the arrow and club, again in reference to his martyrdom.

If other of the Apostles are preferred, we shall be happy to prepare designs for them, each with their appropriate symbols.

The surrounding decorative "canopy" and tracery above with Angels and cloud forms, suggesting Heavenly triumph and steadfastness, so roughly indicated in this color sketch, will be carried out in harmony and in the same exquisite detail characterizing our earlier window.
