General Information

The rectangular openings seem so foreign to the Gothic window opposite, that we have introduced architectural forms in the design of the glass, to modify their shape and to bring them into closer harmony with the architecture of the church.

The central representation of the enthroned Christus Rex robed in the ruby of Divine love holds the globe surmounted by the cross as symbol of His power and domination over the world. At either side are the Alpha and Omega.

The panel at the left is devoted to the Blessed Sacrament with symbols of the Chalice and Host, Wheat and Grapes, and the leaves and fishes of the miracle of feeding the multitude.

The opposite panel is devoted to symbols of the Passion and Redemption.

This is considerably more symbolism than we had first suggested, and I think the cost would be about thirty-eight hundred dollars. A simpler arrangement with just symbols of the Wheat and Grapes in the side panels could be undertaken for three thousand, five hundred.
