General Information To have simple rectangular fields, and symbols of the Trinity, as in Northminster, Evanston window, making all three the same size.

Below these have appropriate texts related to the symbols - from ~~BOOKING~~ PRAYER BOOKS Te Deum (Page 10 of Prayer Book).
~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ "The Father, of an infinite Majesty."
~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ "Thine adorable, true and only Son."
~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ "Also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter."

As planned, we have devoted the three stair windows to the Trinity, with the traditional Hand of God from the cloud in a cruciform halo, the Lamb with the banner of victory, and the descending Dove of the Holy Spirit.

We are suggesting texts from the Te Deum, - "Father of an infinite Majesty...Thine adorable, true, and only Son...also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter".

Alternate texts might be, - "Glory be to the Father... and to the Son...and to the Holy Ghost; or texts related to Worship as found in the Psalms.

We have kept the fields light and brilliant for adequate illumination to the stairs.
