This is to be the elaborate medallion type devoted to Ruth and Job and incidents from their lives as follows:

Lower left: Ruth Gleans in fields - Ruth 2

Upper " Boaz gave Ruth 6 measures of barley which she took home to Naomi. Ruth 3:15-16.

Rector writes: "I would like to stay with the cool greens and yellows (in this window) without completely, of course, omitting the blues which are so beautiful in the other windows we have." Because of the light in the Church.

Lower right: Satan comes to bring evil (testing) to Job. Job 1:2

Upper " The Lord Speaks to him out of Whirlwind. Job 38:1

Bottom medallion left lancet "Obed" son of Ruth and Boaz

" " right lancet "Sacrificial Altar built by Job's friends

As planned, the third from the entrance on the east side is devoted to the Old Testament characters, Ruth and Job.

Ruth is represented gleaning in the fields of Boaz, while at the top, he gives her six measures of Barley. Near by is the symbol of grain. The Lily suggests the sixth Beatitude, - The Blessed Pure in Heart, and with the heart at the top, symbolise Ruth's kindness and virtue. The cross implies her Faith, and with the six pointed Star suggests the Old and New Testaments.

At the base is Obed, son of Ruth and Boaz and father of Jesse, holding the Star of David as the beginning of the lineage culminating in Our Lord.

In the lower medallion of the window devoted to Job, Satan assails him with tribulations. Above, the Lord speaks to him out of the whirlwind.

In the field are the scales of Justice symbolising Job's acknowledgment, and the Wheel of Life shaped by Divine Power. Below is the book of Wisdom not to be solved by man.

At the base is the sacrificial altar erected by Job's friends.

Cool greens and yellows are emphasized in this window.
