General Information Paul and Silas

As a significant memorial to the Vose family, this window is appropriately devoted to the beginnings of the Christian Church.

The dominant figures represent Saint Paul, Apostle of the Gentiles, whose doctrine is set forth in his Epistles; and Silas, the full form of his name being Sylvanus, Paul's companion on his missionary journeys. Legend has it he became first Bishop of Corinth.

St. Paul holds the great sword, recalling his persecution of Christ's followers before his conversion, which is also the symbolic "sword of the spirit".

His open book is inscribed "Spiritus Gladius". The three circles with wavy pattern are the traditional symbols of his martyrdom.

Pentecost is symbolized in the lower part. The Dove of the Holy Spirit, in rays of Divine light, descends on the Apostles, each with the tongues of fire, at his head.

The text from The Acts, Chapter two, third and fourth verses, reads, - "And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire ... and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost." OVER

Crosses appear in the blue fields, and the light border is enriched with red roses of Divine Love and ships symbolizing the journeys over Western Asia Minor, Greece, Macedonia and Rome.

Stars of Heavenly Steadfastness are designed through the blue border of conventional cloud forms.

Space for memorial inscription is provided at the base, and personal symbols may be introduced later.
