General Information Calling the Apostles

On the opposite side, a window represents Christ calling the Apostles, Peter, Andrew, James and John, to be fishers of men. Grapes at either side suggest the vine and branches, and the unity of the Church.

Through the field are symbols of the twelve Apostles, each with a scroll on which their names can be recorded in small letters; at the top, the fish on the book of St. Simon; and the battle-ax and open book of St. Matthias; then the crossed keys of St. Peter; the crossed fish of St. Andrew; the chalice and serpent of St. John; the cross and two loaves of bread for St. Philip; the shells of Baptism for St. James; the boat of St. Jude; the spear and square for St. Thomas; the saw for St. James the Less; and at the sides, the three flaying knives for St. Bartholomew; and the three purses of St. Matthew.

The two houses, one built on rock and one on sand, recall Our Lord's parable of building on solid foundations.
