General Information.....

Three-lancet window, opposite the chancel, devoted to
 The Good Shepherd, and the sheep.
 With the text: The Lord is my shepherd: I shall not want.

Christ, the Good Shepherd, in garments of radiant white,
 holds the staff and the rescued lamb.

Twelve sheep, arranged through the fields of pure blue,
 supported and united by the decorative growing vine, symbolize
 the Twelve Apostles. They all look toward Our Lord.

Across the base are the words Faith, Love and Humility,
 each with significant symbols. The Cross stands for Faith, and
 above is the Hyssop, traditional flower of both Faith and Humility.
 It was the hyssop on which the vinegar was offered to Christ on
 the cross (John 19:29).

Red Roses symbolize Love, and a heart shape is outlined in
 ruby, below.

The violet is the usual flower of Humility, and hands in
 prayer are indicated below. Roses again are designed in the
 heads of the side lancets.

Blue is very definitely the dominant color, well foiled
 with passages of ruby, gold and green; and the areas of silver
 will admit an abundance of light to illuminate this entrance
 portion of the church.
